#### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of India Transact Services Limited (the "Company"), which comprise the balance sheet as at 31 March 2022, and the statement of profit and loss (including other comprehensive income), statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information

The uncertainty on account of Covid - 19 outbreak continued to have adverse effect across the world economies including India in first half of this financial year. The second wave started tapering off towards the end of June/beginning of July 2021. The third wave which was due to Omicron, a new variant of Covid, was the shortest as compared to the previous two waves. It started during the last week of December 2021 and lasted till the first week of February 22. This disruption has impacted performance during the year. However, considering the Company's activities are classified as 'essential services', management does not anticipate material risk to business prospects over the medium to long term. The Company has incurred losses for the year ended 31 March 2022 of Rs. 128.20 million. The Company has noted delays in payment of dues to various parties including statutory dues and consequential impact. Considering the Company's activities are classified as an 'essential services', management believes that the impact of the pandemic may not be significant. As of today, services remain operational, following enhanced internal safety guidelines. The Company has considered internal and external information while assessing recoverability of its assets disclosed in the financial statement upto the date of approval of these financial statements by the Board of Directors. Management has also considered the impact of COVID-19 on the business for the foreseeable future and have concluded that the Company has sufficient resources to continue as a going concern. The impact of the global health pandemic may be different from that estimated as at the date of approval of these financial statements and the Company will continue to closely monitor any material changes to future economic conditions.

On the basis of the above and according to the information and explanations given to us, on the basis of the financial ratios, ageing and expected dates of realisation of financial assets and payment of financial liabilities, our knowledge of the Board of Directors and management plans and based on our examination of the evidence supporting the assumptions, nothing has come to our attention, which causes us to believe that any material uncertainty exists as on the date of the audit report that the Company is not capable of meeting its liabilities existing at the date of balance sheet as and when they fall due within a period of one year from the balance sheet date. We, however, state that this is not an assurance as to the future viability of the Company. We further state that our reporting is based on the facts up to the date of the audit report and we neither give any guarantee nor any assurance that all liabilities falling due within a period of one year from the balance sheet date, will get discharged by the Company as and when they fall due.
